Dear Mr. Genevier:

This is in response to your letter of October 12, 2002, in which you requested information concerning your immigration status. I note from the record that an asylum officer interviewed you on July 2, 2002. The officer referred your case to the Executive Office for Immigration Review (immigration court), Los Angeles on July 16, 2002. You were not granted asylum at that time. This action ended jurisdiction by the Los Angeles Asylum Office, Anaheim, over your case.

The INS record shows you have an appointment with the immigration court on January 23, 2003, for decision concerning your asylum claim. You were issued an employment authorization document on September 17, 2002, which although allowing you to work in the United States, is not evidence of refugee status.

I cannot answer your question about why you were issued a document showing you have refugee status in the United States, but assume it should have read that you have a pending asylum application.
